Program Summary Information:

- Declaring the Minor: Minimum of 2.7 GPA; Passing scores on all three parts of Praxis Core or acceptable alternatives (SAT or ACT scores); Grade in MDSK 2100 or (EDUC 2100 and SPED 2100) of C or better. Students must also complete an "Application for Admission to a Teacher Education Program" in the Office of Teacher Education, Advising, and Licensure (TEAL) in the Cato College of Education. This should occur no later than the second semester of the sophomore year.
- Advising (minor): Required immediately on admission to the minor and at each registration period by the undergraduate education advisor in the Department of Middle, Secondary, and K-12 Education. Course permits are required, and they can only be attained through the advisor.
- Advising (General Education): By advisors in the student's major department in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.
- Minimum Grades/GPA: Minimum GPA of 2.7 to declare; GPA of 2.5 or higher must be maintained to remain enrolled; Grades in professional education coursework must be C or better and the overall GPA in these courses and in the student's major/licensure must be a 2.75.
- Teacher Licensure: YES, Foreign Language Education requires a major in one of the following French, German or Spanish. Upon successful completion of all requirements, students will be recommended for the North Carolina teaching license.
- Night Classes Available: YES, for the minor. (Major cannot be completed at night)
- Weekend Classes Available: NO (occasionally a course may be offered)
- Other information: A yearlong internship (YLI) is a requirement for completion of the minor. This YLI must begin one semester prior to the student teaching semester. An application is required for admission to the YLI and must be completed early in the semester prior to beginning the internship see Office of Field Experiences website (http://ofe.uncc.edu/) for YLI application deadlines. The application for the yearlong internship requires signatures from both the minor and content major advisors. Student teaching is required the last semester upon completing all other coursework required for the minor and content major. Student teaching requires an additional application, that students meet all GPA requirements, and includes the undergraduate minor advisor's recommendation.

Program Requirements:

The Foreign Language Education minor has a *very structured* curriculum. Freshmen and sophomores who intend to minor in Foreign Language Education are classified as majors in disciplines identified above and are pre-foreign language education candidates. During the pre-education phase students are advised by TEAL advisors regarding pre-education admission Rev: 08/2017

requirements and by the advisor in the respective major. Upon admission to full-standing in the Minor in Foreign Language Education program, students continue advising in their major and are advised through the MDSK Advising Center where they plan the remainder of their foreign language education program of studies with the undergraduate advisor in that office (typically the junior and senior years).
